What's been happening at Morningside?



In Nursery, Miss Hasnu talks with us about our feelings and emotions.



And here's Miss Sarah leading a maths carpet time singing our nursery rhyme of the week 5 little speckled frogs.

In Reception we have loved sharing books with each other in our cosy RS home corner.



Also in Nursery, the children are playing with the Duplo and demonstrating teamwork by building towers together.



This term Year 1 are learning about Juan Miro. We took a line for a walk. We drew different types of lines and made sure to not take our pencil off the paper.



Year 2's science topic this term is 'Plants'. In 2M we planted cress seeds and kept them in two different habitats (the window sill and the cupboard) and we observed the speed in which they grew.



This week in 2S we planted cress seeds and have been observing them grow for our science topic 'Plants'. One pot was in the cupboard with no light, and the other pot was by the window getting lots of sunlight - can you tell which pot got the most sunlight?

'During a Geography lesson; the pupils in Year 3 were using their mapping skills to colour code a picture of the British Isles, as well as producing a colour-coded key to represent the different regions.'






What's been happening at Morningside?

In science Year 4 have been learning about the key things plants need so they can grow. We're undertaking an experiment to see what happens if a plant doesn't get enough water! Which of these plants looks healthier?"



Year 5 learnt all about friction today in science. We proved that you can lift a bottle of rice with just one chopstick. Try this experiment for yourself at home to see how friction can be stronger than gravity!

Physical Education

Vision: Physical Education is taught across the school by specialist coaches from **BADU** Sports. Through the use of coaches, we hope children are able to increase their knowledge regarding the rules of sports, the importance of team work and how fitness affects the body. We also desire that children find enjoyment in sports and display good sportsmanship when faced with challenges.

Curriculum

Children across the school are taught net games i.e basketball, netball and football alongside dance, gymnastics and yoga. In the summer, they focus on fitness and athletics as well as games such as rounders and cricket.

The skill focus changes across the year groups to ensure progression as they go up the school.



School Streets

Zone SS14 – Morningside Primary School – Chatham Place and Ram Place


- School Streets is the Council's pioneering scheme to transform roads outside schools, so that only pedestrians and cyclists can use them at school start and finish times.
- The streets tackle congestion and improve air quality at the school gates, making it easier and safer to walk and cycle to school.
- They create a more pleasant environment for everyone, while making sure residents, businesses, pedestrians and cyclists can still use the road.

How it works

The streets around a school temporarily become a pedestrian and cycle only zone at set times in the morning and afternoon. Vehicles are not permitted to enter the zone between these times unless they have been granted an exemption.

Signs inform drivers of the restrictions at the entrance(s) to the closed street(s). **Vehicles are not allowed to enter the School Streets zone during the times of operation**, unless they are registered for an exemption. School Streets will be spot enforced across the borough, and infractions can carry a penalty charge issued by a camera. For more information please visit hackney.gov.uk/school-streets

Safeguarding Children

Information regarding Safeguarding & Child Protection
at Morningside Primary School and Children Centre

Our prime responsibility as a school is to ensure that all children are safe.

Safeguarding can be defined as:

"The process of protecting children from abuse or neglect, preventing impairment of their health and development and ensuring they are growing up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care that enables children to have optimum life chances and enter adulthood successfully."

School plays an important role here. For Morningside Primary School it means that we have procedures for the following:

- Child Protection
- Behaviour
- E-Safety
- Visits
- Incident Management
- Risk Assessment
- Allegation of Abuse
- Child Absconding
- Information Sharing
- Medical Needs
- Supervision

It is important to avoid any coaching of a child during a disclosure. Any early discussion with the child should, as far as possible, adhere to the following basic principles:

- A. Listen to the child, rather than directly question him or her
- B. Never stop a child who is freely recalling significant events
- C. Make a note of the discussion, taking care to record the timing setting and personnel present as well as what was said

Report any concerns to a member of staff straight away – never delay to inform the relevant officer.

Decide the order of your preferences

You should list more than one school (maximum 6). Listing only one school does not mean you will be offered a place.

The order is important. List your favourite school as the first preference, then your next favourite school as your second preference and so on. Listing a school as your first preference does not increase your chance of being offered a place.

Each school is given equal consideration regardless of where you list it in your preferences. The order of your preferences will only be considered if your child qualifies to be offered more than one place.

Getting Started

Your child's teacher will give you a unique MarvellousMe parent join code. You need this to use the app. It's best to download the MarvellousMe parent app from the **Apple** or the **GooglePlay** store.

1 Download the MarvellousMe parent app.

2 Enter your 6-digit parent join code.

3 Tap 'Sign up'.

4 Enter your name, email and make up a password.

5 Tap 'Sign up'.

6 Log in.

If you don't have a smartphone or tablet, you can sign up and log in via www.marvellousme.com. Please use Chrome as your Internet browser.

The app is very easy to use. Just tap on the icons to find your way around. There's a walk-through video and Help Centre at www.marvellousme.com, if you need any help.

Tips for parents



'Activities' tell you what your child is learning, 'Badges' tell you why the teacher has praised your child and 'Messages' keep you up to date. Think of them as conversation starters to everyday questions like: 'What did you learn at school today?' 'Were you good?' 'Have you got any messages?'



Use your new insight wisely and prompt conversations with your child at different times, such as when travelling, over dinner or at quiet times together. It's natural for children to want to unwind and play after school.

Show the MarvellousMe app to your child. It will help them to reflect on their learning and feel proud of the teacher's positive comments.

'Hi5' the teacher every time they send you an update, so they know you are engaged.

Add another child to your app by tapping 'Add Child' and entering their join code.

Share your app with family and friends by giving them the same parent join code that you used, or inviting them in 'Settings'. They will then be able to enjoy the instant updates as well.
